

## Task Tour 13a: The Internet -- with Firefox as your default browser (recommended)

Bring up Web sites; click links; move among screens, pages and tabs; select text; search; and type into forms.

Say commands in order, making sure to watch what happens between commands. Pause at any “ · ” to go step-by-step. Say “UC Lesson” or “UC Full” followed by a lookup number for command details (for example, “**UC Lesson 2 Point 1 5**”).

**IMPORTANT:** Firefox with the Mouseless Browsing add-on is required for this tour -- see **UC Intro 2.3**.

<b>Speech On</b>	Turns the asleep (yellow) microphone on	1.1
<b>Redstart Systems Site</b> (If necessary <b>Control Insert</b> )	Opens Firefox to the Redstart Systems site	9.1
<b>8 Go</b>	Toggles link numbers -- they should be showing	9.3 (6.9)
<b>Screen 2</b> (or <b>40 Down</b> )	Clicks link 8, which brings you to a list of UC Commands	9.3
<b>Screen 1</b> (or <b>40 Up</b> )	Shows the second screen's-worth of information	7.3
<b>12 Go</b>	Shows the first screen's-worth of information	7.3
<b>Go Bottom</b>	Clicks link 12: Resources	9.3
<b>40 Up</b>	Moves the cursor to the bottom of the page	9.5
<b>15 Go</b>	Moves the cursor up 40 lines or more (system/browser settings)	6.6
<b>Go Back</b>	Clicks link 15: Request a Feature	9.3
<b>2 Back</b>	Goes back one page to the Resources page	9.5
<b>New York Times Site</b>	Goes back two pages to the Redstart Systems homepage	9.5
<b>Amazon Site</b>	Opens the New York Times site	9.1
<b>Google Site</b>	Opens the Amazon site	9.1
(Skip next 4 commands if you're not using Tabs -- see <b>UC Lesson 9.5</b> for details)	Opens the Google site	9.1
<b>Tab Forward</b>	Moves right one Tab to Redstart Systems site	9.5
<b>2 Tab Forward</b>	Moves right two more tabs to the Amazon site	9.5
<b>Tab Back</b>	Moves left one tab to the New York Times site	9.5
<b>Document Close</b>	Closes the New York Times tab	9.5
<b>Window Close</b>	Closes the browser	2.3
<b>Washington Post Search</b> (Wait for Google site with Washington Post search code to appear)	Opens the Google site and enters the code to narrow the search to the Washington Post site.	9.7
<b>Grasshoppers</b>	Adds “grasshoppers” to the text in the search box	1.2
<b>Enter</b>	Hits Enter to return a list of pages from the Washington Post site that contain “grasshoppers”	6.1
<b>Rulers Open</b> ( <b>Function 7</b> )	Puts rulers around your screen	2.5
<b>15 By 45 Word</b> (adjust numbers to click text rather than a link)	Toggles arrow/screen commands from scrollbar to text so “Word” and “Lines” commands work properly ( <b>UC Lesson 9 p. 27</b> )	9.6
<b>This Dictionary Search</b>	Places and clicks the mouse, then selects the nearest word	4.9
<b>Top 9 Down · 10 Downs</b> (or <b>15 By 28 · 10 Lines</b> )	Opens Google, types selected Word followed by “site: dictionary.com site”, hits Enter to do search narrowed to the Dictionary site	9.7
<b>Function 7</b>	Moves cursor 9 lines down from top, selects 10 lines (or clicks mouse at beginning of selection, then selects 10 lines)	7.20 (or 4.9)
<b>10 Down</b>	Toggles arrow/screen commands from text to scrollbar	9.6
<b>UC Make</b>	Moves the scroll bar down	9.6
<b>31 Go</b> (or <b>50 By 70</b> )	Brings up the UC “Make a Comment” page	6.6
<b>Cap Here's my comment about speech</b>	Puts the cursor in the Comment field	1.6
<b>Rulers Close</b>	Types “Here's my comment about speech” (feel free to type a real comment here, then say “3 Go” to submit the comment)	9.3
<b>Window Close · Speech Off</b>	Removes the rulers	1.2
	Closes Firefox and puts microphone to sleep	2.5
